Game Assignment Policy



General Provisions

All game official assignments for MUSA matches are made at the discretion of the appointed MUSA Assignor. Factors that influence, but do not solely determine, the offering if any particular game, to a particular Referee are:

- Referee experience in years of USSF/MUSA Certification
- Referee experience based on the number of matches officiated.
- Referee experience based on the competitive level of past matches officiated
- Referee Certification Level
- Referee Age
- Potential Conflict of Interest (i.e. your brother/sister/cousin is on one of the teams)
- Referee ability as determined by MUSA
- Referee behavior & attitude while officiating past MUSA matches
- The number of PENALTY Points a Referee has earned during the current season.

Match Re-Assignments

If you accept a game assignment, please make every effort possible to fulfill this obligation. If for some reason you have to call the MUSA Assignor back and turn back a game assignment, you will earn PENALTY Points for this action. The exact number of PENALTY Points will be determined by the number of hours of notice that you give MUSA. If you earn three (3) or more PENALTY Points, you will be placed on the In-Active Referee List. Your movement back onto the Active Referee List is at the discretion of the MUSA Director of Referees.
